PREFATORY NOTE.

AMONGST my father's papers was found a small packet of sermons and addresses tied together and marked by him as "Overflow of Lessons from Work." Most of these have been already printed, and some of them separately published; but as it appears to have been his intention to bring them together into one volume, it has seemed right to do so. To these papers have been added some of my father's latest sermons, including the address to the miners in Durham Cathedral, which was his last public utterance. The title given to this volume, *Words of Faith and Hope*, is one that he had proposed to give to a collected volume of Peterborough sermons. The title has no special appropriateness to this particular volume; but it is a title of the writer's own choice, and one that is applicable to all his ministerial utterances. Words of Faith are happily comparatively often heard, but Words of Hope, such as he joyed to speak, are less frequent and not less precious.
