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## EXPLANATION OF MARKS.

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1. A comma inserted above the line (') denotes a short pause, less than at a comma in the usual place *in* the line.

2. The acute (´) is used to denote the rising or upward inflection of the voice.

3. The grave accent (`) is used to denote the falling or downward inflection.

Ex.—Éloquence animates.

In pronouncing these words, the voice appears to slide upwards on 'eloquence,' downwards on 'animates.'

4. When words are connected by hyphens, the inflection given to the *first* word must be continued over the others. See Rule XXII.
