THE FERTILIZER INSPECTION IN 1897

This year, as in the past, the New Hampshire College Agricultural Experiment Station has coöperated with the State Board of Agriculture in an inspection of the commercial fertilizers sold in the state.

In accordance with the public statutes, the collection of samples of the different fertilizers has been in charge of the Secretary of the Board of Agriculture, Hon. N. J. Bachelder, who has been assisted by Mr. James A. Foord; while the chemical analyses have been performed under the direction of the chemist of the Experiment Station, Prof. Fred W. Morse, who has had for assistants, Messrs. Chas. D. Howard, Chas. W. Vickery, and Ernest B. MacCreedy.

The following towns were visited by the agent of the Board of Agriculture, during the spring months, and samples were taken of all brands of fertilizers to be found.
