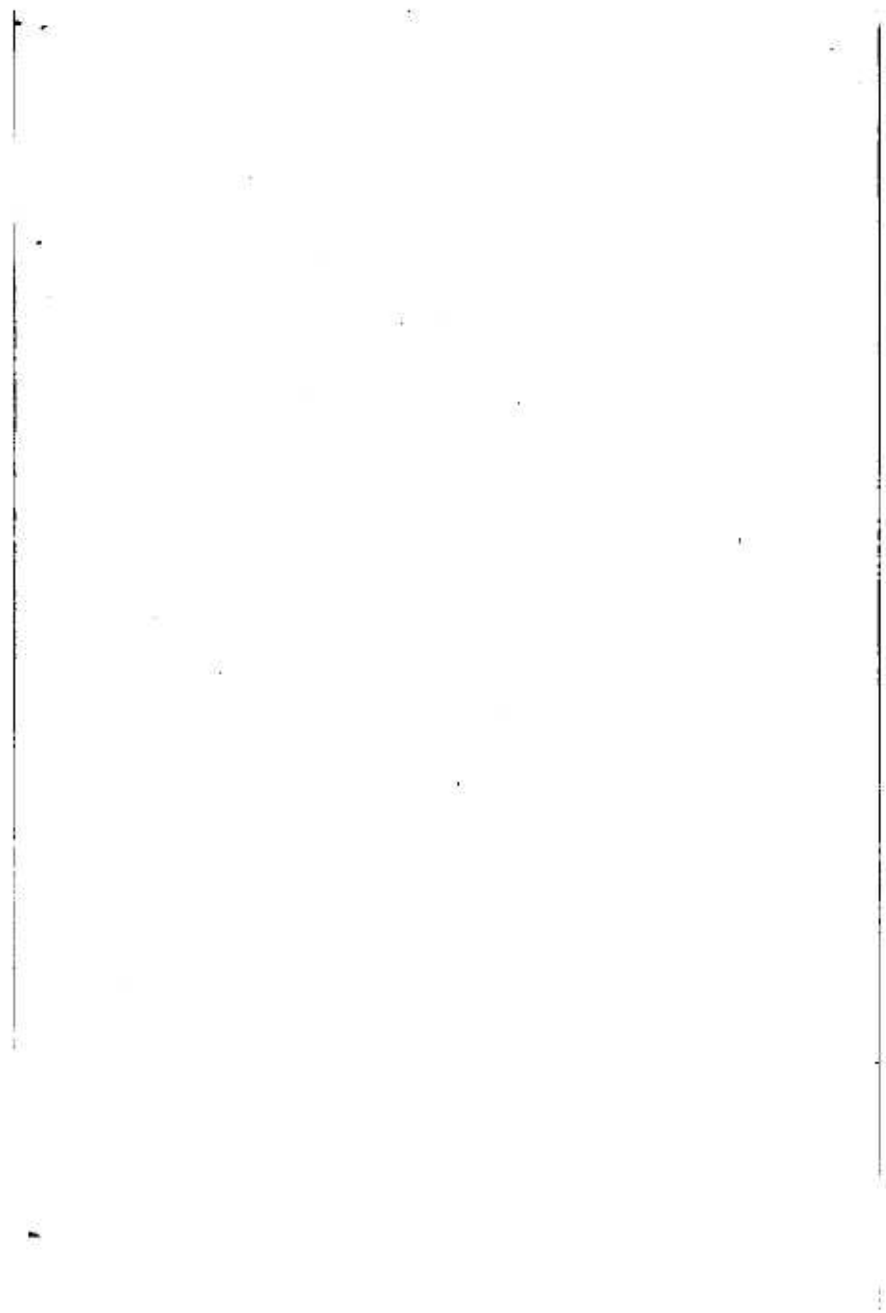

He inspects woods separately, takes stock of their contents, condition, and value; reports fully, sets out timber for sale, arranges planting operations, makes out lists and estimates, directs labour, and, when engaged by the year, overlooks the whole work of the woods. Terms moderate, according to distance.

He has for a considerable time been engaged in reorganising the woods on a number of estates throughout Great Britain, his acquaintance with woods and game preservation in nearly every county, and knowledge of Continental and British forestry, enabling him to advise under a great variety of conditions, so as to avoid the mistakes of the past and secure better crops of timber in the future.

When personal inspection is not desired, he advises by letter if particulars regarding soil, climate, and situation are furnished.
