Durham, the home of the university, is an attractive village on the Portland division of the Boston and Maine railward, sixty-two miles from Boston, fifty-four from Portland, and five from Dover, a city of 15,000 population. Good train service and excellent trunk-line motor roads make the university easily accessible from all parts of the state.

Durham, organized in 1732, is one of the historic towns of New Hampshire. In the early days it was the home of a prosperous ship-building industry. Situated at the head of tidewater on the Oyster river, it served as a distributing center for the interior of the state. During the Revolutionary war it was famous as the home of Major General John Sullivan. Near his home, in the village, the state lass erected a fitting monament to his memory.
