

The Story of My Life

EARLY LIFE.

My parents were born in Southern Connecticut and were from early New England ancestry; my father's ancestors coming to Providence in 1660, and my mother's to Boston in 1630. Both families trace their records back to early English times, having owned estates in England prior to the coming of William the Conqueror in 1066.

The first of my mother's ancestors in this country was William Buell. He was one of those religious enthusiasts known as Puritans, of whom Lord Russell wrote, "They were the most remarkable body of men the world has ever produced." The Buell family went with a company of Church people from Boston, cutting their way through the dense wilderness and settling at what was afterwards Norwich, and there establishing the first settlement made
