FOR THE MOVEABLE AND IMMOVEABLE FEASTS: GRTHER WITH THE DAYS OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE, THROUGH THE WHOLE YEAR.

#### RULES to know when the Moveable Feasts and Holy-days begin.

EASTER-DAY (on which the rest depend) is always the First Sunday after the Full Moon which happens upon, or next after, the Twenty first day of March; and if the Full Moon happens upon a Sunday, Easter-Day is the Sunday after.

Advent Sunday is always the nearest Sunday to the Feast of Saint

Andrew, whether before or after.

Septuagesima Nine: Sunday Eight Weeks before Sexagenina Quinquagesima 38 Seven Raster. Six Quadragessma : Pive Weeks Rogation Sunday Ascension Day Forty Days 35 1 after Easter. Seven Weeks Whitsun Day Bight Weeks Trinity Sunday
