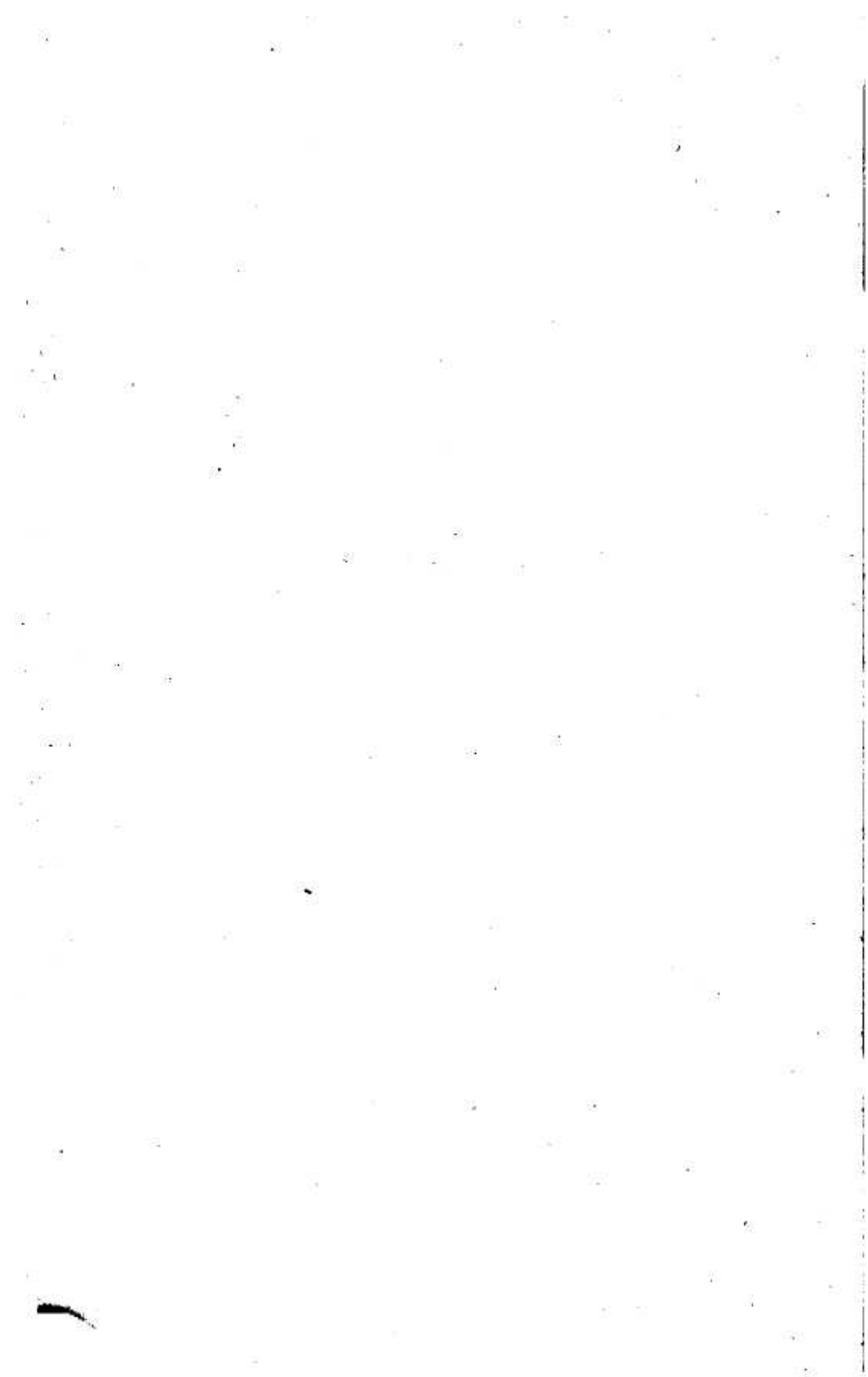

I have the honor to transmit herewith the Sixty-ninth Annual Report of the Trustees of the New York State Library, as required by law.
