PREFACE.

There surely is no lack of Question-Books for Sabbath Schools, and the author of this little volume has confidence in this new attempt for one reason only, and that is, it has been tested. It was prepared for his own Sabbath School and given out in sheets, lesson by lesson. It worked well. To be sure, he had an admirable set of teachers, but not better than every set ought to be.
