THE IRREGULARITIES OF THE TEETH

INTRODUCTION

IT is with a little diffidence that I venture to bring forward a theory of the causes of the irregularities of the teeth, for although I may feel very confident that it is true, there is always the thought that the score or two of theories 1 which have preceded this have been advocated in the fullest confidence by their respective propounders. This reflection does not strike us till we find that we have tried to carry our own point just as our predecessors tried to carry If an apology is needed it might be pointed theirs. out that there may be extenuating circumstances, and in this case there is one at least of first-rate importance. Towards the close of last century there sprang up a school of biologists who denied that acquired characters were transmitted. The question being one of great importance and interest, I made as full an investigation of the arguments which had been advanced as seemed necessary for me to come to a definite conclusion, I was fascinated with the subject,
