PREFACE.

BOTH my critics and the general public have agreeably surprised me. Of the thirty-five newspapers which kindly noticed my first book,* thirty-three were so friendly in their comments, that the most exacting Author could not wish more; while the public have shown their appreciation in a very practical manner. I now venture a second work, in the hope that my readers may feel an equal interest in the places I have since visited, the photographs here given, and the short descriptions of those harbours which accompany the pictures taken.

In my last book there were a few printer's errors, which, I fear, gave my readers some slight annoyance; my annoyance was very considerable. As for example, when so well known a Cape as "Spartivento" was spelt "Sparlivento," and even a better known locality, "Salerno," was spelt "Saler-mo." I must also, in this place, alter a passage, which *was* correct when it was written, but which is now incorrect. I alluded, in that work, to an incident which I spoke of as happening at Palermo, when three of my crew were unjustly fined for supposed smuggling. I then said, "the fines imposed were never returned." Just after my book was in
