#### ERRATA.

It is stated in the Assacle of Hawick, p. 348, that the Chapel of Ease mentioned by Reginald of Durham, as situated on the river Slitrig, was probably on the lands of Penchrise. That a religious house stood there is affirmed by oral tradition, but the chapel dedicated to St Cuthbert, to which Reginald refers, where miracles were performed, was within two miles of Hawick, and consequently a different house altogother from that at Penchrise.
