PREFACE.

The work of examining and cataloguing the graves of the heroes of the Secession War, in and around Richmond, was undertaken in behalf of friends at home, to save them the weary task of groping among the dead for their loved and lost ones. The results of the work, which was carried on by the Agents of the Christian Commission, under the direction of HEN. C. HOVENOR, Chief of the Individual Relief Department, are embodied in the following pamphlet, which can lay claim to only an approximate accuracy. Further search might furnish additional particulars, and we doubt not that such search will be made. But even in aid of this, the record here given will be valuable.

BELLE ISLE.

The Cemetery at Belle Isle has been fenced in by the Commission, but the head-boards remain as when the city was occupied, the names being carved in, not painted.
