(For the Delegates of the Press only.)

IN consequence of difficulties which have arisen with respect to the Copyright of the Index to the Bible hitherto printed at the University Press, and extensively used by the public,—

I have undertaken to prepare what will be, so far as the nature of the subject will admit, a virtually original work; in which a new principle of classification is adopted, many errors in previous publications corrected, omissions rectified, and unnecessary and irrelevant references omitted. Several hundred entirely new subjects have been introduced; while in others an improved arrangement has been adopted. It has had the advantage of revision by several experienced biblical students, Clergymen, and Sunday School teachers; and the best authorities have been consulted.

The compilation of an Index belongs, no doubt, to a very humble department of Literary work, but in this instance, owing especially to the necessity of producing an Edition essentially different from any other, it has involved much anxious thought, great labour and close application, occupying, for many months, every available half hour that could be spared from the demands of the ordinary business of the Press.

It is proposed to be issued, if accepted, simply as "The Oxford Index to the Authorised Version of the Scriptures," without any name attached.
