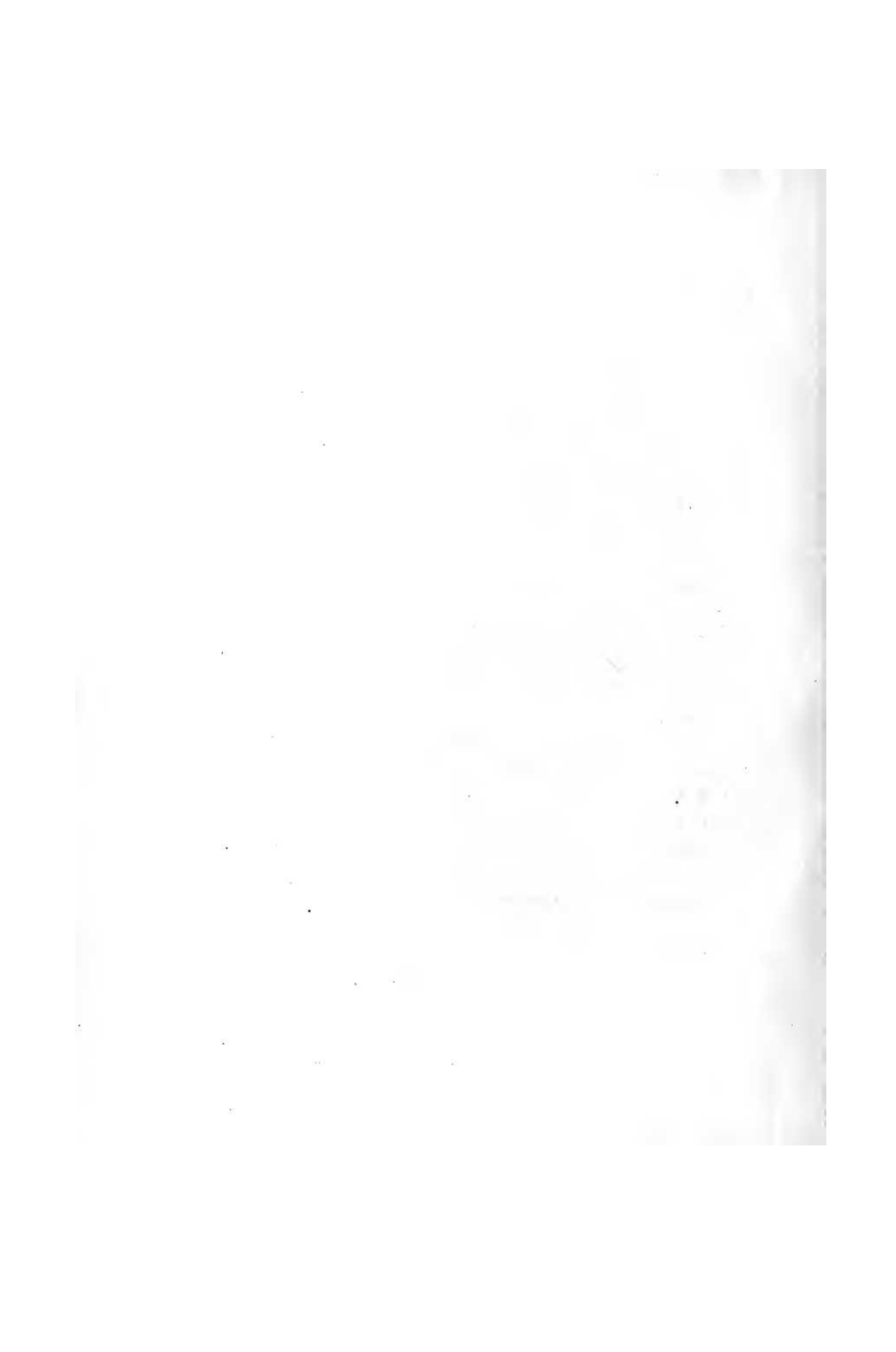

P R E F A C E.

Since the publication of my two volumes on conifers I have been persuaded by various friends to continue the work, which will include practically all the genus Coniferae. I have described and figured from authentic specimens all the known cypresses and junipers which were omitted in the previous volumes. Various rare conifers are included which are not found in the British Isles, as well as new introductions, including *Pseudotsuga macrocarpa*, *Pinus Nelsoni*, the new Chinese genus *Fokienia Hodginsii*, and *Cupressus formosensis*. I have also figured *Cunninghamia Konishii* and *Taiwania cryptomerioides* which have not yet been introduced. Having sufficient illustrations for this volume, I have omitted many genera, including *Widdringtonia*, *Araucaria*, *Podocarpus*, and the Australian and New Zealand species, which I hope to describe in a fourth volume.

My thanks are due to many friends both in England and abroad for the specimens illustrated, to Dr. A. HENRY and Mr. A. B. JACKSON for their assistance, also to Dr. O. STAFF and Dr. A. B. RENDLE for permission to photograph specimens at Kew and the British Museum (Natural History). I am also indebted to Mr. A. R. FIRTH, H.B.M. Consul at Tamsui, for the illustrations of Formosan conifers and the frontispiece.
