PREFACE TO THE SEVENTH EDITION.

A great many new passages have been substituted for old ones in the present edition, and this has made a rearrangement necessary. In addition to the pieces set in Pass Examinations in the Oxford Schools, others set in the Class Schools, in College Scholarships, and various Competitive Examinations have been admitted.

Owing to this extension some of the new exercises will be found harder than the generality of those which appeared in previous editions. It seemed, however, that a sufficient number of easy passages had been retained to warrant the retention of the old title. These will be found chiefly at the beginning, and are calculated to lead up to the more difficult ones that follow. The references to Latin authors will be found useful in helping the student to deal with the latter by suggesting an appropriate style and syntax.

Also more examples of continuous narrative have been inserted; partly to engage the interest of the learner, and partly to give the teacher an early opportunity, as similar expressions recur, of judging how far his hints and instructions have been appreciated.
