Classified Sanitarium Directory of the Brooklyn Medical Journal



HIS Directory is intended for the physician's use in selecting sanitarium for his patients. So far as we know, it is the first classified Sanitarium directory ever published. Directories giving lists of Sanitarium usually give no information regarding the class of diseases treated by the different Sanitarium, and the physician's only guide in the past has been medical journal advertisements and the recommendations of his friends. This Directory is presented with the hope that it will save the physician much valuable time.

Private Sanitarium in general may be divided into three classes: Sanitarium for nervous and mental, chronic, and special diseases. In the first class belong those Sanitarium which make a specialty of treating the diseases of the nervous system, including neurasthenia and the milder nervous diseases, alcoholism and drug habits, the neuroses, and insanity in its various forms. The so-called "Sanitarium for the treatment of chronic diseases" usually include in their scope of treatment such diseases as Rheumatism and Gout, Neurasthenia, Diabetes, Bright's Disease, diseases of the Digestive System, Bronchial diseases, Catarrh, Cardiac affections, diseases of the Genito-Urinary System, etc., both Medical and Surgical. The growing tendency of Sanitarium to specialize has given us the third class. On account of the nature of certain diseases, it is better that persons affected be isolated. Thus we have special Sanitarium for the separate treatment of such diseases as Tuberculosis, Epilepsy, Alcoholism and Drug Habits, etc.

The lines of division between these classes are not clearly drawn—in fact many Sanitarium accept almost any case (with the exception of infectious and contagious diseases) that may come to their doors. In this publication we have, for convenience, grouped the sanitarium under the following heads: Nervous Diseases, Neurasthenia, etc., including the milder forms of nervous diseases; Mental Diseases, including the various forms of insanity; Alcoholism and Drug Habits; Epilepsy; Chronic Diseases, General Invalidism, including "Rest" cases; Rheumatism and Gout; Gynecological Cases; Tuberculosis, Surgical Cases; Obstetrical Cases; Children's Diseases; Carcinoma (Cancer), and Electrical treatment.

Almost without exception Sanitarium doing general Sanitarium work will not accept patients afflicted with Tuberculosis, or any infectious or contagious disease.

The New England and Middle States, with their mountains, valleys, and sea coast, offer a varied climate suitable for the treatment of a wide scope of diseases. Springs producing water of great therapeutic value are found at many points. Atmospheric conditions vary from the cold, dry air of the Adirondacks to the moist climate of the seashore. This field offers a wide selection to the physician seeking a Sanitarium for his patient.

TO THE PHYSICIAN

IN selecting a sanitarium, first turn to the class to which your patient belongs. After making a selection, turn back to the general list which gives the name of the physician in charge of each sanitarium, the address, etc.

As many Sanitaria do not accept noisy, untidy or otherwise objectionable patients, the physician should always correspond with the physician in charge, giving a history of his patient.


