GUESS FARMING.

E farmers are a stubborn class to learn. We do not accept facts without a good deal of proof and persuasion, and in too many cases work

out our own injury through a fear of being too easily deceived. This is a progressive age, and those who allow themselves to fall in the rear in the march of improvement must be content to occupy second-rate positions, and be satisfied with small pecuniary rewards.
