

PREFACE.

THIS edition is designed chiefly for those students who have already some knowledge of Greek, but are not advanced enough to grapple with the difficulties of Thucydides. The historical value and interest of the *Hellenica* are very great, and the Greek is sufficiently difficult and instructive even for a high Form.

The apparatus criticus in Otto Keller's larger edition has been found very useful for the revision of the text; but I have adopted very few of the changes which he has introduced on the suggestion of Cobet, Nauck, Hartman, and others. I am also indebted to the editions of Breitenbach, Büchsenschütz, Manatt, and Underhill; to the histories of Grote, Mure, Curtius, and Hohn; also to Mr Dakyns's Introduction and Translation, to Mr L. Whibley's *Political Parties in Athens*, to Prof. Goodhart's

Eighth Book of Thucydides, and to the editions of Aristotle's 'Aθηναίων πολιτεία by Mr Kenyon and Dr Sandys.
