INTRODUCTION.

This little work is intended to supply the clinical clerk and student of medicine with a concise guide to the recognition of the more important characters of the urine; and from its small size to serve as a companion at the bedside to the busy practitioner, who may be unable to consult the larger works on the subject. A plan for the examination of the urine, step by step, has been given, with an account of the method for ascertaining the nature of those alterations that most frequently occur in disease. An appendix has been added in which the manner of estimating the urea, chlorides, phosphates, sugar, &c., by volumetric or other rapid analysis has been described.

In order that the examination of the urine may be made on a definite plan, the following scheme, in which the most important clinical facts are directed to be ascertained, is recommended to the student. The order of examination that is here given should be followed, the details of each operation being described on the page stated at the end of each paragraph.

SCHEME FOR THE EXAMINATION OF THE URINE.

- Observe the colour of the urine, its appearance, if clear, smoky, turbid, &c. (page 3.)
- II. Ascertain the specific gravity, (page 6.)
- III. Examine the reaction, whether acid, neutral, or alkaline, by means of litmus or turmeric paper, (page 9.)
