#### RULES OF THE CHETHAM SOCIETY.

RULES OF THE CHETHAM SOCIETY.

1. That the Society shall consist of members being subscribers of one pound annually, such subscription to be paid in advance, on or before the day of general meeting subscribers of one pound annually, such subscription to be paid in advance, on or before the day of general meeting in each year. 7. That twenty copies of each work shall be allowed to the editor of the same, in addition to the one to which he may be entitled as a member.
