THIS selected bibliography follows closely in arrangement and character the bibliography published in 1898 by the American Manual Training Association. As in the earlier publication, the aim has been to prepare a helpful working list of the most important and suggestive literature upon the history, theory, and practice of manual training rather than an absolutely comprehensive bibliography.

A considerable quantity of pamphlet material is still represented in the lists, but the proportion of such matter in the addenda is extremely small as compared to that in the original compilation, indicating, it is fair to assume, a natural and healthy tendency in manual training literature toward more stable forms of publication.

The effort has been still to confine the lists closely to matter relating to *educational manual training*. Not only has all matter concerned strictly with engineering, technical and industrial education been omitted, but works dealing solely with technical processes, not aimed directly at school use and conditions, have been excluded.

The few foreign works included in the lists have been suggested by leading authorities in the countries represented, and have been selected with a view to their representative character and their suggestiveness to American readers.
