THE PLANTAGENETS—HOUSE OF ANJOU.

1.-HENRY IL-CURTMANTLE.

1154 to 1189 A.D.—35 years.

- 1. Honry the Second, the first Plantagenet King, was the son of Gcoffrey, Count of Anjou, and Maud, daughter of Henry the First. He was the most powerful King of his time—ruling not only England, but also the greater part of France. He also subdued Wales and Ireland.
- 2. His first care was to lessen the power of the barons; and this he did by causing many of their castles to be destroyed. Then, wishing to rule the clergy, he took into his favour a priest named Thomas Becket—a Norman by birth, and son of a wealthy London merchant—gave him great wealth and power, and made him Archbishop of Canterbury.
 - 3. But Becket, when he had got this great power,
