PREFACE.

THE extensive introduction of terms of Latin and Greek origin into the nomenclature of the physical sciences has long been felt as an impediment to the progress of the student who happens to be unacquainted with these languages. In few studies has this been more felt than in that of Botany, which, though in itself at once attractive and of easy attainment, has been rendered to the unlearned repulsive and difficult, by what naturally appears to them the uncouth jargon in which its lessons are to a great extent conveyed. Unquestionably thousands, more especially females, have been deterred from entering on this otherwise very inviting study, by the hopelessness of being able to surmount this formidable obstacle. Nor is the student who is totally unskilled in the languages of Greece and Rome the only one by whom this difficulty is felt. Even the classical scholar, unless very deeply read, and comparatively fresh from his philological studies, must often feel greatly at a loss to decipher, and con-
