THIS Index has been compiled solely with reference to Volumes II., III., IV., and V. of the British Reports upon the Paris Universal Exhibition.

Under the headings of the various countries which were represented at the Exhibition, as well as under the various classes of manufactures, &c., will be found three kinds of entries,—(1) an analysis of Exhibitors' names; (2) a list of the objects shown by the country, or a list of the countries contributing manufactures, &c.; and (3) a series of miscellaneous entries having reference to the country or class of manufacture, product, &c., collectively.

The analyses above referred to, include the names of such Exhibitors as are specified by the different reporters, but they are not therefore to be considered as *complete* indices to all Exhibitors throughout the Exhibition. The British Official Catalogue which was published in 1867 supplies the want of such complete indices so far as respects the Exhibitors of the United Kingdom.
