#### PREFACE.

It is unnecessary to say more here than that the tracing of the mental and physical aspects of child-hood, intensely interesting and highly important as they are, must be regarded as quite subordinate to the point of view from which the child is contemplated in these pages, namely, the Spiritual. The mental, as well as the corporeal, are now receiving deserved investigation, but the Spiritual has been almost exclusively in the hands of those whose special purpose has been the classification of the various qualities of spirit according to the theological system whose claims they accept, usually as a theoretical assumption.
