TENDER and melancholy interest lingers about a glade in the Vicerogal Grounds. In this spot Her Excellency the Countess of St. Germans planted a tree (*Pinus insignis*) to preserve a remembrance of her sojourn in Ireland. Within a year, the tree withered and died, the very month of the Lady's own death. Toucherf by the coincidence, Lord Carlisle wrote a few tributary lines, and had them inscribed on a memorial stone, placed where the tree had been.

A short time ago, Dr. Butler, Head Master of Harrow, when visiting Lord Spencer at the Viceregal Lodge, chanced to read the lines, and, appreciating their poetic feeling, translated them into Latin verse. Other translations were contributed, and thus these "Nugæ" originated. Here collected, they are dedicated to the memory of the good and gentle Countess of St. Germans.
