WHOSE WORKS HAVE DEEN USED IN PREPARING THIS VOLUME.

ALCOCE, J., Mus. Doc., died 1806, was Organist of the Cathedral, Lich-field.

ALDENDE, Rev. H., D.D., born 1647, died 1710. Dean of Christ Church, Orford. The anthema bearing his name are in many cases adaptations of Palestrina's music to English words.

ANGEL, A., Organist of Exster Cathedral.

ABCANETZ, A., a Bolgian Composer, pupil of Josquin. His writings chiefly date about the middle of the aixteenth century.

ARMES, P., Mus. Doc. Organist of Durham Cathedral.

ARNOLD, SAMUEL, Mus. Doc., died 1802, was Organist of the Chapel Royal, S. James', and of the Royal Chapel, Windsor.

ARNOLD, G. B., Mus. Doc., Organist of Winehester Cathedral.

ATENS, R. A., Organist of S. Asaph Oathedral.

Arrwoon, T., Mus. Doc., born 1767, died 1838, was Organist of S. Paul's Cathedral and Composer to King George IV.

AYLWARD, T., Mus. Doo., died 1801. Organist of S. George's, Windsor, and Professor of Music at Gresham College.

Averon, E., Mus. Doc., died 1808, was Master of the Children of the Chapel Royal.

BACH, JOHANN SHBANTAN, the fellow countryman and contemporary of Handel, born in the same year, 1685, at Eisenach. Organist at Arnstadt, Mühlhausen, Weimar, and Kothön, successively, and from 1723 to 1760, the date of his death, Kapel-meister at the Thomas' School, Leipsic.

BANES, B., Organist of Rochester Cathedral, died 1841.

BARNET, JOEMAH, pupil of Gonnod. Organist and Choir-master of S. Andrew's Church, Wells-street, London.

BATES, -..., Organist of Ripon Cathedral.

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SHORT NOTICES, &c.

BATTEN, ADRIAN, died 1640, was Vicar-Choral and Organist of S. Paul's Cathedral in the reign of Kings Charles I. and H.

BATTISHILL, J., born 1788, died 1801. Was Organist of Christ Church, Newgate-street, London.

BEORWITH, J., Mus. Doc. Was Organist of Norwich Cathedral, died 1809.

BEDEMORE, -.. , Organist of Liehfield Cathedral.

- BERTHOVER, LUDWIG VON, horn 1770 at Bonn on the Rhine. A pupil of Vander Eden and Neede. In 1783 he became the pupil of Haydr, and subsequent to that date he received instruction from Albrechtsberger. He died in 1827 at Vienna.
- BELLANY, T. L., born 1770. A pupil of Dr. Cooke. He was appointed Master of the Choir of his Catholic Majesty's Chapel under the Spanish Embassy, 1819.

BENNETT, A., Mus. Bac., Organist of New College, Oxford. Died 1880.

BRNNETT, WILLIAM STREAMDALE, Mus. Doc., Professor of Music in the University of Cambridge.

BEST, W. T., Organist of S. George's Hall, Liverpool.

- Bian or Brans, W., born 1644, died 1623. He was originally a Singing boy in Edward VI. Chapel. Was chosen Organist of Lincoln Oathodral in 1663, where he continued till 1669. He survived his Master, the celebrated Tallia, 33 years.
- BIRHOF, J., died 1737. He was a pupil of Rosingrave and subsequently appointed Organist of Winchester Cathedral.

BLAKE, Rev. J., D.D., died 1860, a Prebendary of Salisbury Cathedral.

- BLOW, J., Mus. Doc., born 1648, died 1768. He was one of the first sot of children of the Chapel Royal after the Restoration. On the death of Palham Humpbries, 1674, he was appended Master of the Boya. He succeeded Purcell, in 1696, as Organist of S. Margaret's, Westminster, and subsequently became Organist of Westminuster Abbey and Composer to the Chapal Royal. Among his pupils were Henry Purcell, Jerevish Clarke, and Dr. Croft.
- Borcz, W., Mus. Doe, born 1710, died 1772. He was pupil of Dr. Greene. In 1736 he was appointed Organist at S. Michael's, Cornhill, in the room of Mr. Joseph Keiwey, and Composer to the Chapel Royal, on the death of Mr. John Woldon in the same year. He succeeded Dr. Greene in 1765, as Master of the Royal Band of Musicians, and in 1768 was appointed one of the Organists of the Chapel Royal, in the room of Mr. John Travers then deceased.

BOND, H., Lay Vicar of Exeter Cathedral in 1760.

BOND, C., Organist of Coventry, about 1770.

Buox, Z., Mus. Doc., Organist of Norwich Cathedral.

BULL, J., Mus. Doc., horn 1568, died 1630. He was educated under W. Blitheman, Organist to Queen Elizabeth, and appointed one of the Gentlemen of the Chapel Royal in 1686. In 1591 he was elected Organist of the Chapel Royal. He died as some say at Hamburgh, having resigned his professorship in Gresham College and other English appointments in 1807.

BROWN, ---, Organist of Linhfield Cathedral in 1771.

CALAH, J., Organist of Peterborough Cathedral, died 1799.

CAMPOR, J., Organist of York Minster, died 1860.

CAMDER, M., was Organist of York Minster.

CAMPOR, J., Mus. Doc., was Organist of York Minster, died 1854.

CLEARSHMI, GRACOMO, born at Padua 1582, died 1690. He is said to have been the teacher of Scarlatti. He was appointed Ohapel-master of the German College, and of the Pontifical Chapel at Rome, about 1640.

CHARD, W., Mus. Doc., Organist of Winchester Cathedral and College, died 1849.

CHERUSINI, born at Florence 1760, died in 1842 at Paris, where he was Director of the Conservatoire.

CHILDE, W., Mus. Doc., born 1606, died 1696. He was Organist of S. George's Chapel, Windsor, and of the Royal Chapels in the reigns of Charles I., Charles IL, James II., and William and Mary.

CHIFF, -, Mus. Doc., Organist of Ely Cathedral.

CLARI, C. M., Chapel-master of the Cathedral of Pistoga. He was a Composer of eminouco as early as the year 1695.

CLAMPI, F., a Neapolitan Musical Writer, died 1740.

- CLARE, JEREMIAH, died 1707. He was one of the Children of the Chapel Royal under Dr. Blow, whom he succeeded as Almoner and Master of the Choristars in S. Panl's Cathedral in 1693; he was also afterwards elected Organist of the same Cathedral, and in 1704 was admitted a joint Organist of the Chapel Royal togother with Dr. Croft.
- CLARGE, WHITTHEID, MUS. Doc., born 1770. He was appointed Organist of Armagh Cathedral in 1795. In 1795 he became Organist at Trinity and S. John's Colleges, Cambridge. In 1820 he was elected Organist of Hereford Cathedral, and in the following year was chosen Professor of Music in the University of Cambridge.
- Coors, B., Mus. Doc., died 1793. About the year 1780 he was Organist and master of the Choristers of Westminster Abboy.
- COORD, R., Organist and Master of the Choristers of Westminster Abbey, died 1814.
- **Conset**, J., born 1740 died 1820. Originally a Chorister in Salisbury Cathedral. In 1782 he became one of the gentlemen of the Chapal Hoyal. In 1792 he was elected Organist of Salisbury Cathedral, which office he vacated in favour of his son Arthur, in 1804.
- Convs. A. T., born 1773. He was placed as Chorister at Westminster Abbey and in 1804 succeeded his father as Organist of Salisbury Cathedral.

CORFE, C. W., Mus. Doc., Organist of Christ Church, Oxford.

CORFS, J. D., Organist of Bristol Cathedral.

- CHEVORYCON, Rev. R., D.D., Iown 1439, died 1736, non of the Hinhop of Bath and Weis. In 1674 he become Canon Residentiary and Chanter of the Cathedral Church at Weils.
- CROFT, W., Mus. Doc., born 1676, died 1727, one of the children of the King's Chapel. In 1764 he was appointed joint Organist with Jeremiah Clarke, of the same Chapel Royal, and in 1708 succeeded Dr. Blow as Master of the Christers and composer to the Chapel Royal, and Organist of Westminster Albey. As crumposer to ther Majesty Queen Anne, the frequent victories under the Dake of Mariborough, called upon him to furnish many Anthema of thankagiving.
- Carron, W., Mus. Doc., hown 1775, died 1848, was Professor of Music in the University of Oxford, and for some years Organist of Carist Church and Magdalene Colleges.
- CALBORNE, LANGDON, Mus. Bac., Organist of S. Michael's College, Tenbury.

DARS, J. C., Organist of Hereford Cathedral, died 1820.

- Down, W., Organist of Worcester Cathedral.
- DOWLAND, JOHN, Mus. Doc., born 1562. He died in Denmark in the year 1615.
- DUPUIS, T. S., Mus. Doc., born 1733, died 1796, a pupil of Travers. On the death of Dr. Boyce, 1779, he was appointed Organist and Composer to the Chapel Royal in the reign of George III.
- DURANTI, F., a Neapolitan Composer, died 1775.

Espon, T., Organist of Durham Cathedral, died 1811.

ELVEY, S., Mus. Doc., Organist of S. John's and New College, Oxford, died 1861. 1

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ELVEY, G. J., Mus. Doc., Organist of S. George's Chapel, Windsor,

- FARRANT, HICHARD, horn 1520, a fine old Composer of Church Music. Was a gentleman of the Chapels Royal in the reigns of Edward VI. and Elizabeth, and in 1664 was elected Organist of S. George's Chapel, Windsor. In 1660 he resigned his appointments in the Royal Chapels, and died in 1685.
- FORD, -... Organist of Carlisle Cathedral.

(JABLAND, ---, was Organist of Norwich Cathedral about 1770. (JABLENT, G. M., Mus. Doo., Organist of S. John's College, Cambridge, (JATES, B., Gentleman of the Chapel Royal, died 1750.

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
