CHAPTER 1.

AN ACT to repeal an act entitled "An act to regulate and provide for the advertisement of sales of real estate under judgments of courts of equity and executions in Morgan county."

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

§ 1. That the act, entitled "An act to regulate and provide for the advertisement of sales of real estate under judgments of courts of equity and executions in Morgan county," which was approved March twenty-sixth, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, be, and the same is hereby, repealed.

Approved February 14, 1896.

. CHAPTER 2.

NACT to repeal an act, entitled "An act to incorporate Funk Seminary, at LaGrange, in Oldham county," approved April twenty-second, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, "and to repeal all other acts, charters and laws enacted by the General Assembly, incorporating, Funk Seminary and all acts and charters, amendatory of such acts."

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

§ 1. That the act, entitled "An act to incorporate Funk Seminary; at LaGrange, in Oldham county," approved April twenty-second, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, be, and the same is hereby repealed, and all other acts, charters and laws enacted by the General Assembly incorporating Funk Seminary, or appointing trustees therefor and all acts, charters and laws amendatory of such acts, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Approved March 3, 1896.

CHAPTER 3.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of claims, per diem and mileage of witnesses and officers in penal and criminal causes removed from the courts of this State to the United States Courts.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

§ 1. That in all criminal or penal causes or prosecutions which may be removed from any of the courts of this Commonwealth to any court of the United States for this State under the provisions of any statute of the perdiem United States, the officers of such United States in Court and the witnesses who may be summoned and attention to the court in behalf of the Commonwealth in such United cases, shall be entitled to charge and receive for their Courts.
