TO THE GOVERNOR:

In accordance with the statute, creating the Universal Exposition Commission, representing the State of New York, we hereby have the honor of submitting the following report:

The bill providing for the Commission became a law May 9, 1899, and on the 24th day of December, under the provisions of the act, Governor Frank S. Black appointed the following Commissioners:

The appointment of one Commissioner in the Sixth Judicial District was left for Governor Roosevelt to fill, which he did by naming Mr. EDWARD G. WYCKOFF of Ithaca.

The first meeting of the Commission was held in the State Capital on Tuesday, December 27th, and an organization was effected by the election of Norton P. Otis of Yonkers for President; Lamott M. Blakely of Lyons for Vice-President, and Mrs. Clarence Burns as Secretary pro-tem. At the meeting, the question of Secretary under the law was discussed at some length, but action was deferred and the Commission adjourned to meet in New York on the 16th day of January, 1900.

Prior to the assembling of this meeting, a conference was held with Commissioner-General Peck, representing the United States, and certain lines of work to be followed by the New York State Commission were discussed. At this second meeting, committees were appointed as follows:
