The first meeting of the Commission was held in the State Capital on Tuesday, December 27th, and an organization was effected by the election

of Norton P. Otis of Yonkers for President; Lamott M. Blakely of Lyons for Vice-President, and Mrs. Clarence Burns as Secretary pro-tem. At the meeting, the question of Secretary under the law was discussed at some length, but action was deferred and the Commission adjourned to meet ir New York on the 16th day of January, 1900.

Prior to the assembling of this meeting, a conference was held with Commissioner-General Peck, representing the United States, and certain lines of work to be followed by the New York State Commission were dis cussed. At this second meeting, committees were appointed as follows:
