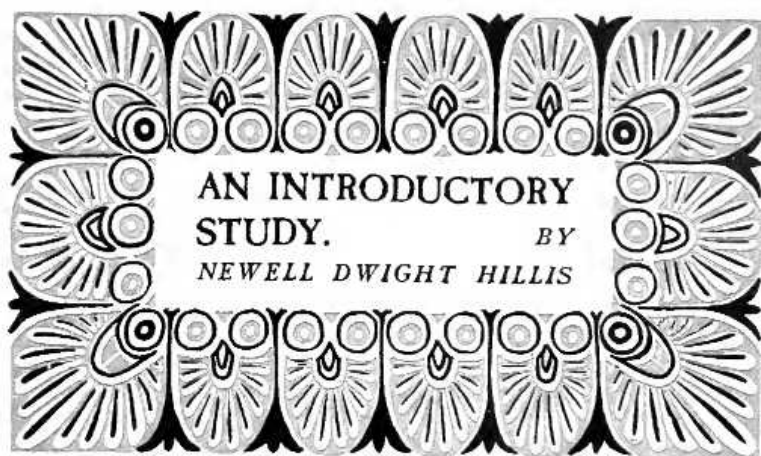

O, that some one would give me a drink from the well that is by the gate of Bethlehem!	


