Derbyshire 1832—1834; Succeeded as Earl of Burlington 1834 to Dukedom 1858; Chancellor London University 1836—1856; Cambridge University 1861—1891; Victoria University, Manchester 1880; K.G. 1858; P.C. 1876; Donor of Cavendish Laboratory to Cambridge University; One of the Founders of the Royal Agricultural Society 1839 and President 1870; Trustee of the British Museum 1871.

23. **Coke, Sir Edward. 1552—1634.**
 Trinity Coll., entered 1567; M.A. by grace; M.P. Aldboro' 1589; Norfolk 1592; Liskeard 1620; Coventry 1624; Solicitor-General 1592; Speaker 1592—3; Attorney-General 1593—4; Chief Justice of the Common Pleas 1606, of the Queen's Bench 1613; High Steward of the University of Cambridge 1614.

24. **Colenso, Rt Rev. John William. 1814—1883.**
