THE COUNCIL OF THE CAMDEN SOCIETY, having reason to believe that many gentlemen are deterred from becoming Members of the Society by the difficulty and expense of securing a complete set of the Society's publications, have determined to take advantage of the General Index now in course of preparation to close their first series with the works included in such Index, and to commence a fresh series.

The CAMDEN was the first Society established on the popular principle which has since been so widely adopted. It was instituted to perpetuate, and render accessible, whatever is valuable, but hitherto little known, amongst the materials for the Civil, Ecclesiastical, or Literary History of the United Kingdom; and it accomplishes that object by the publication of Historical Documents, Letters, Ancient Poems, and whatever else lies within the compass of its design, in the most convenient form, and at the least possible expense consistent with the production of useful volumes.

The services which the Society has rendered to Historical Literature by the publication of the one hundred and five volumes which have been issued by it, have been universally recognised.

It is hardly necessary to say that the ground now occupied by the Camden Society is totally distinct from that which of late years has been taken up by the series of Chronicles and Documents published under the superintendence of the Master of the Rolls. These publications are limited to a period ending with the reign of Henry the Seventh; whereas the Camden Society, though it will still continue to make use of documents which, from their brevity, or from any other reason, are not suitable for the series of the Master of the Rolls, will find its principal work in the unpublished matter relating to the history of our country during the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth centuries, which is of so varied and interesting a character. The Council, therefore, are anxious to appeal to all students of English History for that support without which it will be impossible for them to accomplish the work before them.

The Subscription to the Society is £1 per annum, which becomes due in advance on the first day of May in every year, and is received by Messrs. NICHOLS, 25, Parliament Street; in return for which the Subscriber receives three volumes, except when one of the publications is of unusual length. Any considerable accession to the list of subscribers would, however, enable the Council to increase this number.

No Books for the year are delivered until the Subscription has been paid.

Members may compound for their future Annual Subscriptions by the payment of £10 over and above the Subscription for the current year. The compositions received have been funded in the Three per Cent. Consols to an amount exceeding £500.

New Members are admitted at the Meetings of the Council held on the first Wednesday in every month.
