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

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PREFACE.

The following Lectures were delivered at the Royal Infirmary of Glasgow during the author's official connection with that institution. They were afterwards published in The Medical Press and Circular. The subjects treated of are regarded in strict conformity with the views enunciated in the author's pamphlet "On Therapeutics and Disease," published in 1870. Of these opinions, at the time, some were considered novel, if not outré. The satisfaction of seeing many of them adopted by leading members of the profession, even without acknowledgment, is here avowed. Prominently among these may be noted the important rôle ascribed to the products of retrograde metamorphosis as morbific agents, and the explanation of the therapeutic effects of alkalics in lithiasis.

Now offered in this form, revised and amplified, the hope is indulged that the lectures may prove acceptable to some of those who heard them with such courteous attention, to others of the class for whom they were intended, and to practitioners whose time and opportunities preclude the study of more elaborate works.
