ADDITIONAL RECORDS

To the Nicholas Cady Genealogy.

HE following family records were received since the publication of the Cady Genealogy, and well deserve a supplement for their preservation, because of their value and interest. The figures at the left refer to the page and number of the Cady Genealogy where these new records connect.

Page 14, line 17. DATE OF NICHOLAS CADY'S MARRIAGE.

It is stated that he presumably married Judith Knapp about 1648, but recent information received from Rev. Isaac Goodell renders it nearly certain that the marriage occurred in the early part of 1650.

Page 34, No. 17. Record of Amy Tyler and Aaron Goodell.

Amy Tyler, dau. of Daniel and Jane (Cady) Tyler, b. Brooklyn, Conn., Dec. 10, 1733; m. Nov. 27, 1760, Aaron Goodell, b. Mansfield, Conn., July 26, 1733. She d. Hampton, Conn., Sept. 13, 1811; he d. Chaplin, Conn., Mar. 27, 1823.

Daniel Tyler, father of Amy, was a well-to-do farmer in Canterbury and owned a slave. He married three times and had 21 children. At the time of his death, Feb. 20, 1802, he had six children, 50 g. children, and 120 g. g. children, all living. His second wife was Mehitable Shurtleff. Their son, Daniel, b. 1750, m. (2) Mrs. Sarah (Edwards) Chaplin, g. dau. of Rev. Jonathan Edwards. Their son, Daniel, b. 1799, m. Emily Lee. Their dau., Gertrude Tyler, m. Charles Caraw, whose dau., Edith Kermit Caraw, m. ex-President Theodore Roosevelt.

Aaron and Amy (Tyler) Goodell had a son Isaac, b. Mansfield, Conn., April 10, 1770; m. Nov. 27, 1804, Chloe Hammond. He d. May 1, 1856; she d. Jan. 27, 1870. Their son, Walter Goodell, b. Hampton, Conn., July 6, 1806; m. Dec. 9, 1827, Sally Washburn. He d. Haverhill, Mass., July 7, 1872; she d. Nov. 24, 1886. Their son, Rev. Isaac Goodell, b. Chaplin, Conn., Nov. 21, 1846; unm. After receiving a good common school education, he studied music in Boston, and has composed many pieces. He was for a time at Andover Theological Seminary. Thence in 1876 he went to Nebraska as a missionary, also laboring in Illinois and Michigan. Was ordained a Congregational minister Oct. 31, 1877, at Hillsboro, Ill. Labored in California for some years and then went to the Harrison Islands in 1884, as missionary and teacher for some five years, then returned to California, Texas and Missouri; then to Haverhill, Mass., in 1902, on account of failing health. Has retired from the ministry. Is now engaged in literature and music.

Page 88, No. 105. JEREMIAH 5 CADV, (William 1). Added record.

The following extract, copied by Miss Tracy, who was employed for the purpose by Mr. C. C. C. Bradley of Manchester, Iowa, is given a place here because of the light it throws upon the record of Jeremiah Cady's family. Dated from Saratoga, Surrogate's office:

"To the people of the state of New York, free and independent, to all persons literate, and more especially to John Cady of Saratoga, farmer.

Whereas, it is represented to us that Jeremiah Cady of Saratoga, farmer, lately died intestate, leaving goods and chattels within this state by means whereof the granting of administration of said estate does appertain unto us, and we, being desirous that the same may be administered according to law, you are therefore required to cite Letitia Cady, widow of the deceased Jeremiah, Warren Cady, William Cady, Phineas Cady, Lydia, - Lucy Baker, and Abigail Bacon, the next of kin to the said deceased, to appear at the Surrogate's office of the said county at Wellstown, on the 5th day of Nov. next. Dated this 6th day of Oct., 1798. Signed Henry Walton. Saratoga County, ss.: John Cady of the town of Saratoga, farmer, being duly sworn, on his oath declares that he has served the within citations on Letitia Cady, Jeremiah Cady, Warren Cady and Abigail Bacon, by reading the same to them, and further, that a copy of the written citation was affixed in a public place near the dwelling-house of the said Jeremiah Cady, deceased, since the 6th

day of Oct., last, until this day, and further said deponent saith not. Given before me this 5th day of Nov., 1798, Henry Walton, Surrogate of the County of Saratoga,"

The above extract shows that all of Jeremiah's children, who were born in Connecticut, were alive at the time of his death, about Oct. 1, 1798, and accounts for two more, Lucy and Abigaii, who must have been born after he moved to Windsor, Mass. Also that John, Warren, Jeremiah and Abigail were living so near to Saratoga that John could read the citations to them. The others perhaps married and settled in Mass.

Page 94, No 114. DAVID5 CADY, (Eheneser4). Added record.

David Cady remained in Florida, N. Y., with most of his children until about 1830, when several of his sons removed to Fairport, N. Y. Later four of the sons removed to Southeastern Michigan, where most of their descendants are now located. David Cady m. (2) Lorina Pratt. He d. April 25, 1845, and is buried in Perrington, N. Y.; his wife d. 1846 and is buried by his side. Children: (1) Daniel Lovejoy, b. 1787. (2) David, b. 1791. (3) Irene. (4) Samuel Pratt, b. 1800. (5) George Washington. Of the above, Samuel Pratt Cady had James B., who had William B. Cady, now a member of the law firm of Shaw, Warren, Cady & Oakes of Detroit, Mich., who has furnished the foregoing information and who plans to compile the record of his g. grandfather's descendants.

Page 226, No. 268. Descendants of OLIVER 6 CADY. Completed.
