LAWS OF NEW YORK, 1865.

CHAPTER 504.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE

"THE UNIVERSITY CLUB"

IN THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

Passed April 28, 1865.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Theodore Woolsey Dwight, George T. Strong, John Taylor Johnston, Charles Astor Bristed, Henry R. Winthrop, Charles F. Chandler, Joseph H. Choate, Edmund Wetmore, Francis E. Kernochan, Eugene Schuyler, Edward Mitchell, Luther M. Jones, and Russell Sturges, Jr., and such other persons as are now associated, or may hereafter be associated with them, are hereby constituted a body corporate by the name of "The University Club," to be lo-

cated in the City of New York, for the purpose of the promotion of literature and art, by establishing and maintaining a library, reading-room, and gallery of art, and by such other means as shall be expedient and proper for such purpose.

- § 2. The said corporation shall have the power to make and adopt a constitution and by-laws, rules and regulations for the admission, suspension, and expulsion of its members, and for their government; for the collection of fees and dues; for the election of its officers, and to define their duties; and for the safe keeping and protection of its property and funds; and from time to time to alter or repeal such constitution, by-laws, rules, and regulations. The persons named in the first section of this act shall constitute the trustees and managers until others are elected in their places.
- § 3. The said corporation may lease, purchase, or take by deed, devise or bequest, any real or personal estate, and hold or lease the same; provided that they shall
