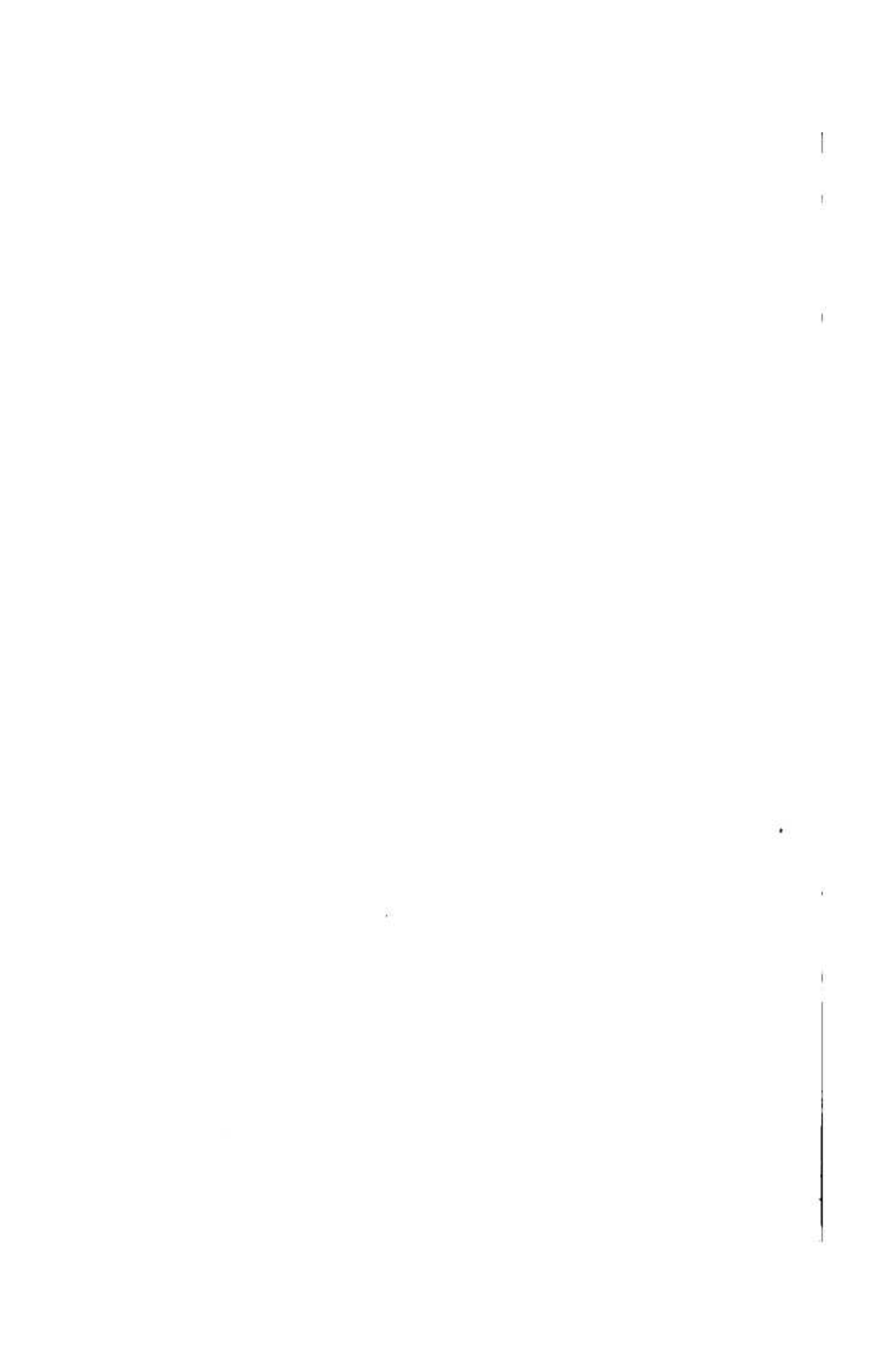

## I. GEOGRAPHY

### A. COURSES AND DISTANCES

**T**HE courses and distances were usually inserted in the journals at the close of each day's record; when so given, they have been allowed to stand in the text. In other places, they were grouped consecutively for a number of days, or for some stretch of the route. In such cases, we have transferred them from the text to this division of the record, indicating the writer of each section and the codex wherein found. — E.D.]
