INTRODUCTORY.

A^T a meeting of the Session of the Second Presbyterian Church, held on March 24, 1908, at the house of Elder David McCulloch, it was, on his motion, resolved that the fiftieth anniversary of the foundation of this church be celebrated with appropriate ceremonies. Elders William Jack, Samuel M. Clarke and Frederick F. Blossom were appointed a committee to formulate a plan to be laid before the congregation at a meeting to be called for that purpose. At that meeting, which was held May 13th, the following committee was appointed with full power to arrange for and to superintend the celebration, namely: Mr. William A. Herron, chairman; Mrs. Virginia B. Bash, Mr. Thomas A. Grier, Mrs. J. H. Morron, Mr. Samuel M. Clarke, Mr. David McCulloch, Miss Sarah J. McCoy, Mrs. George T. Page and Mr. John A. Chalmers.

This committee adopted the following program for December 6th and 7th, which, with slight variation, was carried out. On account of Mr. N. G. Moore's inability to remain his address was transferred to the Sabbath School and Rev. Joseph W. Cochran was put in his place on Monday afternoon, and in the necessary absence of Rev. J. H. Morron, the correspondence was read by Elder James M. Rice.
