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PREFATORY NOTICE.

ALL Prophecy, in its relation to these latter times of the world's history, may be reduced to three grand heads:—I. The Egyptian bondage, for a set period, of spiritual Israel—the affliction of the Church-militant, under the power of Antichrist, until her final triumph at the Redeemer's coming. II. The ingathering of a remnant of the chosen seed—the restoration of Israel after the flesh, as a people prepared for the Lord at the Redeemer's coming. III. The final catastrophe—the inauguration, in the destruction of the wicked and the resurrection and glorification of the saints, of the Church-triumphant at the Redeemer's coming.

Of these mysteries it is expressly stated, that they are sealed up and closed until the time of the end (Dan. xii. 4, 9); and the fact that they are now gradually unfolding themselves is, in itself, not the least important of the signs of the times in which we live.
