A Journal Commenced at River Dubois - Monday ^{17th} 1804
May 14th 1804 Showery day Capt Clark set out in
a block of ice for the long term expedition. The party
consisted of 3 Sergeants and 38 working hands which manned
the Boat how and two Progres we sailed up the Mississippi
6 miles and succeeded in the N. side of the River.

Thursday May 15th 1804 Rainy morning found the
later part of the day sailed both and returned 100 miles
the N. side some land cleared the soil very rich

Friday May 16th 1804 set out early this morning pleasant
arrived at St Charles at 2 o'clock. In one hour found
a great number of French people came to see the Boat
etc. this place is very old French Village settlement

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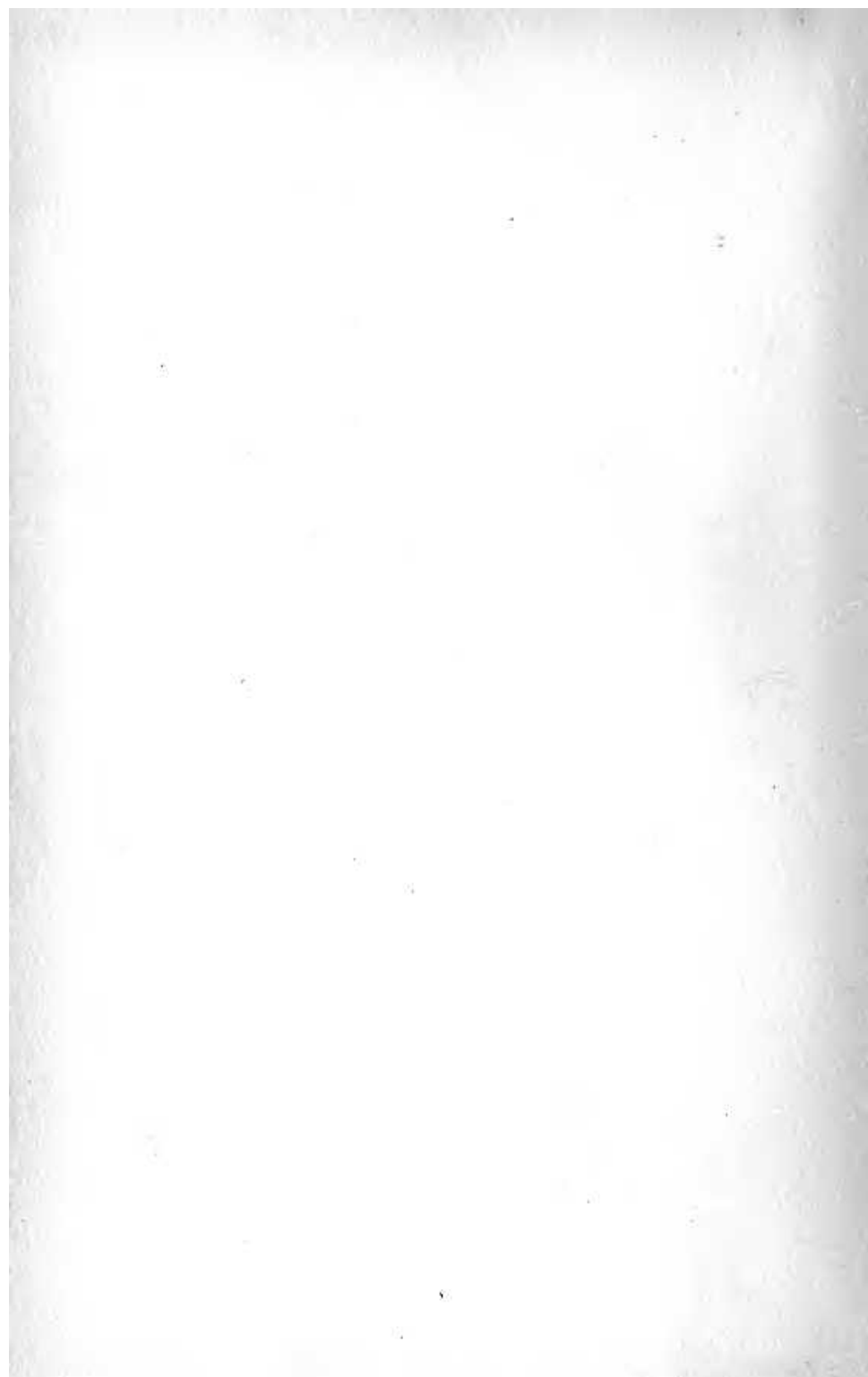
