### IN CONTROVERSIES RESPECTING THE SABBATH AND THE LORD'S-DAY.

#### I.—THE PATRIARCHAL PERIOD.

##### GENESIS.

###### CHAP. I.

In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. And the earth was without form and void, and darkness *was* upon the face of the deep : and the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. 1 2

And God said, "Let there be light:" and there was light. And God saw the light, that *it was* good : and God divided the light from the darkness. And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day. 3 4 5

And God said, "Let there be a firmament\* in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters." And God made the firmament, and divided the waters which *were* under the firmament from the waters which *were* above the firmament : and it was so. And God called the firmament Heaven. And the evening and the morning were the second day. 6 7 8

And God said, "Let the waters under the heaven, be gathered together unto one place, and let the dry *land* appear:" and it was so. And God called the dry *land* Earth, and the gathering together of the waters called he Seas : and God saw that *it was* good. And God said, "Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, and the fruit-tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed *is* in itself, upon the earth : " and it was so. And the earth brought forth grass, and herb 9 10 11 12
