GENERAL STATEMENT.

PURDUE UNIVERSITY is the State Institute of Technology. It derives its name, through legislative enactment, from John Purdue, who gave to the State for the use of the institution one hundred and fifty thousand dollars. It has also received a number of gifts from other individuals.

It has an endowment fund of three hundred and forty thousand dollars, received from the general government, and is further supported by legislative appropriations and by the proceeds of annuities granted by the general government.

Its nonproductive plant is valued at about one million, one hundred and fifty-three thousand dollars. This includes two hundred and forty acres of land, twenty-three buildings, and a most extensive equipment, including laboratories, shops, museums, library and reading rooms.

The School of Pharmacy of Purdue University offers excellent training for those who expect to engage in the retail drug business and for those who desire to enter the laboratory of a manufacturing pharmacist. The instruction also constitutes a good preparatory course for those who anticipate attending a school of medicine.

Students are engaged at the University about six hours each day. There are neither lectures, recitations

nor quizzes in the evening, that time being allotted to home study and to preparation for the ensuing day's work. The student has, therefore, no time for clerking in a drug store, and should devote his undivided time and energy to his school work.
