- "C."--Centre.
- "Ex."-Exit.
- "Ent."-Enter.
- "Excunt."-Exit more than one.
- "Exeunt omnes."-All on stage exit.

SANTA CLAUS PROTESTS

(A Christmas Dialogue for one girl and one boy, with fairy song that may be omitted if preferred)

Characters.—Santa Claus, Mrs. Santa Claus, Christmas Fairles, as many as practical.

Costumes.—For Santa Claus, the regulation dress. Mrs. Santa Claus—Handsome black gown with train, hair powdered, small, white lace cap. Christmas Fairies—White dresses, short and full, neck and arms bare, white gauze wings, hose and shoes of white, white wands, hair flowing.

Scene.—The home of Santa Claus. Handsome interior. Table at rear of stage near R. entrance; on this table, glass pitcher with water and several glasses. Large armchair at F. C., smaller chair near by. Santa Claus discovered at rise, asleep in large chair.

MRS. S. (enters R., yoes to table and pours water
