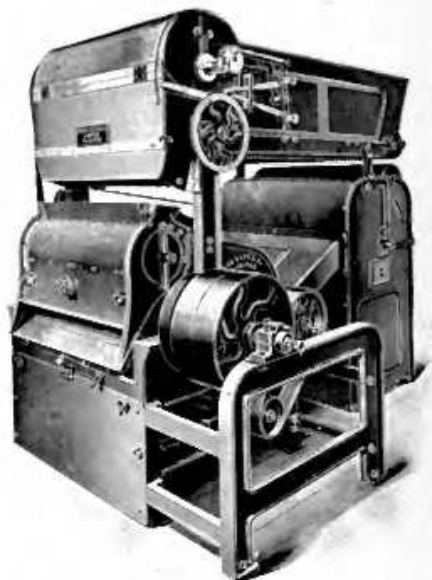

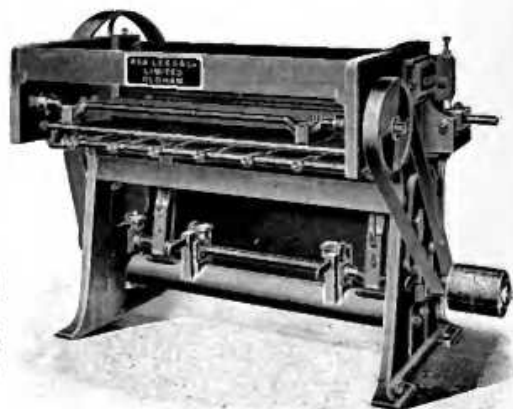


Improved Saw Gin with Feeder and Condenser.
